



1 Ride only on designated shared trails and stay on the trail as otherwise you may damage the environment you have come to enjoy.

2 Leave no trace. Take all rubbish home - yours or anyone else's you find.

3 Share this code with other trail users and encourage others to be responsible carers of the trails and the environment.

4 Cross natural watercourses at designated crossing points.

5 Notify the council or NHAG of trail obstructions or damage.

6 Obey all signs and any temporary notices of trail diversions or closures.

7 Clean all equipment of soil and vegetation prior to heading out on the trail. Clean out your horses hooves.

8 Alert other users to your presence on the track. Say "Hi"; a new friend may be only a greeting away!

12 Come along to a working bee in the reserves to play your part in preserving and improving this natural community resource. See www.nhag.org.au for working bee dates.

11 Undertake some basic education in weed identification, and assist land managers in quickly identifying and eliminating new outbreaks of problem weeds.

10 Avoid riding in the reserves during or immediately after very wet weather & on days of high fire

9 Be considerate of other trail users. You will meet some walkers & bike riders who are unfamiliar with horses & unsure about passing them on the track. Ensure you either walk quietly past other users on the trail, or remain still as they pass you.
